The System Analysis and Modelling (SAM) conference provides an open arena for participants from academia and industry to present and discuss the most recent innovations, trends, experiences and concerns in modelling and analysis of complex systems using ITU-T's Specification and Description Language (SDL-2010) and Message Sequence Chart (MSC) notations, as well as related system design languages — including but not limited to UML, ASN.1, TTCN, SysML and the User Requirements Notation (URN).

SAM 2020 is co-located with MODELS 2020, held in Montreal, Canada.

Scope and Topics:

This year's edition of SAM will be under the theme "Languages, Methods, and Tools for AI-based systems, including languages and methods standardized by the ITU-T, and domain-specific languages. Also included are software engineering technologies, such as for requirements engineering, software verification and validation, and automated code generation.

Authors are therefore invited to submit papers related to this year's theme including the following non-exclusive list of topics:

- Evolution of languages
- Model-driven development
- System engineering models
- Industrial application and tool reports

Types of Submission:

<u>Technical papers:</u> Academics and industrial submissions as either long papers (max 10 pages) or short papers (max 4 pages) in ACM format.

<u>Doctoral session papers:</u> A doctoral submission paper (max 4 pages) must be authored by the students only.

Journal Special Section:

Authors of selected long research papers accepted at SAM 2020 will be invited to submit revised, extended versions of their manuscripts to a special section of the Elsevier Journal of Information and Software Technology (IST).
